Dear Cousins,

Thank you for purchasing the "2003 Supplement to Changing Pastures".

We are all very proud of both of the Arnold Family History publications. You and the next generations of your family are sure to get a great deal of pleasure from them and will find them a valuable reference in the future.

The true sale price for the 2003 Supplement should be \$25 each, which still represents exceptional value. We would be grateful if, after receiving your copy, you would send us an extra \$5.00 for each book ordered. This small amount from each of you will go into the fund to continue the work of your next committee.

The publication of the 2003 Supplement and the staging of the 2nd Arnold Family Reunion would have been very difficult without the support and generosity of the Arnold Family members and the hard work of your committee and all those who have given so freely of their time and energy. The present committee was able to get started and meet the various expenses, such as printing, mail-outs, telephone contacts, hire of hall and facilities, purchase of commemorative plaques, insurance, etc. with the money raised during the 1993 Reunion and from sales of Changing Pastures.

When planning for the 2003 Supplement and Reunion, we surveyed the family to gauge the level of interest. We received a very good response that indicated a high level of interest and we estimated the book size and the quantity required. Based on those figures, we calculated a final sale price of \$20, which gave a small margin to go in the bank for the next committee.

Two things then occurred to catch us out - firstly, when we actually asked for commitment, the response was not as great as anticipated and we had to reduce the number of books printed and secondly, the size of the book grew by about 25%. Unfortunately that resulted in an increased cost per book from the printer and, while we are not making a loss, we are not making enough to ensure a healthy "nest-egg" for the next committee to get started and to continue the work for the next generation.
