I also beg to acknowledge receipt of the letters which Your Excellency's predecessor caused to be addressed to me - 23 December last, containing a flattering testimonial of my services to the colony and I have the honor to state that the same have been kindly noticed also by H. B. M. Commissioners in London - In continuing my exertions to direct the current of German Emigration to South Australia I respectfully suggest to Your Excellency the propriety of an application to receive from the Emigration fund such proportion as H. B. M. German Subjects may have contributed by their purchases of Government land - by which their friends & relatives may be enabled to follow & I beg to state that it will suffice this object that such assistance be paid on their arrival at Adelaide.
