Emigration to South Australia I respectfully
suggest to Your Excellency the propriety of an
application to receive from the Emigration
fund such proportion as H. B. M. German
Subjects may have contributed by their
purchases of Government land — by which
their friends & relatives may be enabled to
follow + I beg to ^(say) hope that it will suffice
this object that such assistance be paid
on their arrival at Adelaide.
