THIS IS THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT of me JOHANN GODFRIED ARNOLD of Albury in the State of New South Wales Retired Storekeeper I hereby revoke all former wills and testamentary dispositions at any time heretofore made by me. I HEREBY GIVE DEVISE AND BEQUEATH unto my wife AGNES WEIR ARNOLD the sum of ONE THOUSAND POUNDS to be paid to her as soon as possible after my death free from all succession probate and other duties or charges and direct that my said wife shall have the right during her lifetime to occupy for her own use as a residence the house in which I reside in Mecanley Street Albury aforesaid or any other house that I may be occupying at the time of my death or if I shall not be occupying any such house at the time of my death then I direct my Trustees to purchase a house for the use and occupation of my wife during her lifetime at the value not exceeding One thousand two hundred pounds or if my wife so desires in lieu thereof to pay to her the sum of Thirty shillings per week together with the use of the furniture which I now possess or any furniture substituted therefor provided that such right of occupation shall not include the bulk store and premises on the allotment where I now reside AND I also further direct that my Trustees shall pay to my wife from and after my decease the sum of FOUR POUNDS per week during her life. However should my said wife prefer to accept a weekly payment of Five pounds per week in lieu of Four pounds per week and the One thousand pounds in cash bequeathed to her as hereinbefore provided she shall be at liberty to do so upon notifying her decision to my Trustees within one month of my demise and for this purpose I direct my Trustees to convert into money such part of my estate that shall not consist of money to invest a sum therefrom sufficient to pay the weekly payment as decided upon by my wife in the manner hereinbefore directed AND to divide the residue amongst my daughters in equal shares and if any of my daughters shall predecease me I direct that my Trustees shall pay the share of such of my daughter so dying to her children per stirpes with the exception of Mrs. Grono's daughter Lily who has entered a Convent and will not require it and her share to be equally divided between Mrs. Grono's remaining children AND also excepting my grandchild Helen in the event of her entering a convent. From and after the death of my wife I direct that my Trustees shall dispose of the house and furniture to be used and occupied by my wife as hereinbefore provided and the rest and residue of my property

Should my wife at any time during her life time desire to live in a smaller place or otherwise vacate the house which I shall be occupying at the time of my death and not require the use of the furniture therein contained then I empower my Trustees with the consent of my wife to make such arrangements either for the purchase of a more suitable place or any other agreements that they may deem to be equitable for my wife during her lifetime including a power of sale of the residence and furniture for the time being occupied by my wife. I desire to point out that I am not making any provision for my sons in this my last Will and testament for the reason that I have made adequate settlements on them during my life time and I hereby appoint my sons JOHN ERNEST ARNOLD and WILLIAM FREDERICK ARNOLD and my Solicitor FREDERICK JOHN BELBRIDGE to be the Executors and Trustees of this my Will but not so as to preclude my Solicitor Frederick John Belbridge from charging for professional work done in connection with my Estate.
